

Scholarships 2024 – 2025

GENERAL INFORMATION

Residencia Universitaria Sarrià offers its own programme of grants every academic year. In order to benefit from these grants, applicants must meet the conditions established in this call for applications in accordance with general, academic and economic requirements (income and assets).

GRANTS AND AMOUNT

1. General programme: with nine scholarships with a 10% discount

Residencia Universitaria Sarrià offers a total of 9 general scholarships awarded on the basis of the applicant's academic merits, taking into account income or family equity requirements

2. Programa especial: una beca variable con una ayuda máxima del 50%

The special scholarship will be awarded exclusively to students with an exceptional academic record and who are also in a situation of special financial need.

CONDITIONS

In order to apply for a scholarship at the RUS, the following conditions must be fulfilled:



Exemplary academic record and performance. The Residence wants to reward residents who demonstrate a clear commitment to academic excellence. For this reason, only applications from students with an outstanding academic record will be considered.



Justified grounds of financial need. In addition to academic merits, the income and family wealth of each applicant will be taken into account. This amount will vary according to the total income of the family unit, as well as whether this is sufficient to cover the costs associated with the accommodation service.



Special circumstances

Other residents with special circumstances such as an exceptional medical situation, illness, special vulnerability, etc. may apply for the scholarship with the corresponding justification and personal interview.



Profile and personal interview

In the case of new students, the residence hall will assess, by means of a personal interview, other aspects to be taken into account, such as their attitude and commitment to their studies, daily responsibilities, as well as other activities that they carry out outside the academic framework. The student's financial contribution to the family, if any, will also be taken into account.

Continuity

Residents who are not first-year residents and who already have a grant in the residence hall must meet the following conditions:

- **Performance Commitment.** In the event of receiving the scholarship, the candidate undertakes to provide information on his/her qualifications whenever the Admissions Department deems it necessary. If the Residence considers that the performance requirements are not met, it will cancel the scholarship granted.
- **Behaviour commitment.** Failure to comply with the Rules of Behaviour required by the Centre will, in addition to the reprimands derived from the non-compliance itself, lead to the automatic cancellation of the scholarship, even if the academic year has not ended.
- **Attendance Commitment.** In the case of unjustified absence, as well as not being up to date with payments from the centre, the scholarship granted will be cancelled immediately.
- **Participation Commitment.** In addition to the above points, it will also be taken into account that the scholarship holders actively participate in the life of the residence hall in order to enrich the interpersonal relationships between students through their collaboration in activities or other proposals of our organisation.

DEADLINES AND RESOLUTION

The call for applications ends **on 10 June** and the admissions department will personally notify applicants of the scholarship decision **from 20 June** onwards.

APPLICATION PROCESS AND DOCUMENTATION



Online registration form for the full academic year. This must be for a full course in a shared room basis. The admission process is independent from the scholarship application, however, it must be carried out in parallel, providing all corresponding documentation in addition to the admission interview.



Scholarship application form. The last page of this document must be submitted, since all fields being mandatory, as well as the presentation text which must be completed by hand.



Grades for the last three academic years. If you are at university, the last official grades.



Copy of the last income (parents or dependants). Photocopy of the last salary slip of each and every parent or dependant. If you are an employer, declaration of companies in your name and profit and loss account.



Copy of corresponding tax return. If it is individual, it must be submitted separately for each parent or dependant. Self-employed and freelance persons must submit it instead of the pay slip.



Copy of assets statement. If not enforceable in your territory, a sworn letter must be submitted with the family's assets and property wherever located, including property, cars, savings or investments, etc.



Other grants. In case of receiving other grants, please indicate and/or attach the award documentation stating the amount.

In some cases and after the academic assessment of the documentation, the Admissions Department will call shortlisted candidates for an interview.
